- 2. Read **John 19:30** and **Hebrews 7:25**. What did Jesus mean when he said, "It is finished." What specifically was accomplished by Christ on the cross? How have we been saved to the uttermost?
- 3. Read **Hebrews 10:11-14** and **Romans 8:30**. How can we be at once both perfected for all time and in the process of "being sanctified?" How can Paul put our glorification, a yet future event, in the past tense along with the other verbs in that chain?
- 4. Read **Romans 8:18**. How can the doctrine of eternal security inform our thinking about suffering? Is there anyone that you can encourage with these truths this week?
